



MESSAGE FROM OUR BOARD CHAIR AND DEVELOPMENT COORDINATOR

Dear Friends,

2014 was a fantastic year for the Muskingum Watershed Conservancy Foundation. The Foundation funded twelve projects throughout the watershed, including a rapid deployment craft for the Tappan Lake Volunteer Fire Department, ice rescue equipment for the Piedmont Lake Marina, several environmental education programs for children, and a number of improvements to the Messerly Recreation Center at Charles Mill Lake Park. Since 2004, the Foundation has funded 60 grant projects totaling nearly \$300,000. Without the support from our generous donors, none of this would be possible.

The 16th Annual Golf Outing, held on August 14, 2014 at Oak Shadows Golf Club in New Philadelphia, was the Foundation's largest fundraiser ever. The Foundation raised over \$16,000 from this event, doubling last year's record-breaking year! Because of this tremendous support, the Foundation will be able to fund even more grant projects next year and make a bigger impact in our watershed. As the Conservancy District invests into its future, it will be even more critical that the Foundation supports this growth. It will be more important than ever to build our endowment to insure in the District's future. And, it will be more important than ever to spread our philanthropic scope to support conservation and recreation projects throughout our watershed community.

In this first ever Annual Report of the Foundation, we highlight the Messerly Recreation Center and the extraordinary donor who established the fund and is in large part responsible for this beautiful building, which graces the shores of Charles Mill Lake and the cover of this report.

Messerly Recreation Center

Donna Messerly had a vision for Charles Mill Lake Park. Ms. Messerly is the long-time activities leaders at Charles Mill Lake Park and a retired professor from Ashland University. Ms. Messerly has long desired a facility at Charles Mill Lake Park that could host the numerous activities held throughout the year.

Ms. Messerly established the Messerly Recreation Center Fund in 2010 through an agreement with the Foundation. Her fund was set up as a new fund within the Foundation that could accept charitable donations. Ms. Messerly stipulated that donations would specifically support the construction and maintenance of a future activity center at her beloved Charles Mil Lake Park.

Her overwhelming generosity prompted the MWCD to begin the design and construction of an activity building. When the Messerly Recreation Center opened on May 17, 2014, Donna's dream became a reality.

The Messerly Recreation Center Fund has already

funded several grants for upgrades to the facility, including a picnic table, planters, an automated external defibrillator, and roll-down doors to permit year-round use.

"The Messerly Recreation Center is a true testament to Ms. Messerly's generosity and the culmination of her charitable goals," said Muskingum Watershed Conservancy Foundation Development Coordinator Nick Lautzenheiser. "She is truly grateful that everyone enjoys the new facility and is happy that she helped make it possible."

Ms. Messerly had the vision and generosity that helped shape an MWCD park; the Foundation helped her realize this dream.

Established to support equestrian trail development and maintenance in and around Pleasant Hill Lake Park.



Established to support the general administrative and operating costs of the Foundation and projects throughout the Conservancy District.


