The Muskingum Watershed Conservancy Foundation is dedicated to supporting the mission of the Muskingum Watershed Conservancy District by providing financial resources that enhance facilities, programs and conservation efforts on or adjacent to District lands and waters.

About the Foundation

The MWCD Charitable Endowment Fund was established in 1996 as a component fund of the Stark Community Foundation to provide donors an opportunity to make tax-deductible contributions to support the mission of the Muskingum Watershed Conservancy District (MWCD). In February 2001 the Muskingum Watershed Conservancy Foundation was officially incorporated as a 501(c)3 nonprofit charitable organization with the mission of providing financial resources to enhance facilities, programs, and conservation efforts on or adjacent to Conservancy District lands and waters.

There are currently 14 charitable funds within the Foundation, which support conservation, water quality, recreation, and environmental education projects throughout the Muskingum Watershed. Since 2004, the Foundation has funded 70 projects totaling over \$300,000.

In addition to supporting worthwhile conservation and recreation projects, the Foundation was created to help donors meet their charitable goals. The Foundation has helped a number of individuals realize dreams and honor loved ones by establishing charitable funds in their memory.

Charitable Funds

CHARITABLE ENDOWMENT FUND

Established to support projects and programs throughout the entire MWCD.

THOMAS W. HUDSON ENDOWMENT FUND

Established in memory of Thomas W. Hudson, this fund supports preservation and conservation projects for Atwood Lake including, but not limited to, shoreline restoration, dredging and reforestation.

CROSSROADS RC&D CONSERVATION FUND

Established to continue the legacy of the former Crossroads RC&D Council and supports natural resource conservation, environmental education, and outdoor recreation projects within the MWCD.

BIKE AND HIKE FUND

Established to support bicycling and trail infrastructure projects throughout the MWCD.

BOATING SAFETY AND EDUCATION FUND

Established to support programming for boater education and safety at Atwood Lake. Donations to this fund support programs such as the Junior Sailing Program.

BUTCH HEAVILIN MEMORIAL DOG PARK FUND

Established in memory of Butch Heavilin, this fund supports the development and operation of a dog park at Atwood Lake Park.

JAMES R. PITNEY LAW ENFORCEMENT FUND

Established in memory of former MWCD Ranger, James R. Pitney, this fund supports training and education benefits for MWCD rangers and peace officers in Ashland and Richland counties.

ATWOOD LAKE PARK FUND

Established through an agreement with the Atwood Area Fall Festival, this fund supports capital improvements at Atwood Lake Park.

ATWOOD LAKE PARK AMPHITHEATER FUND

Established to help with improvements to the amphitheater site at Atwood Lake Park, and for the addition of amenities to enhance the visitor experience.

REGIS WISSLER ENDOWMENT FUND

Established in memory of Regis Wissler, this fund supports improvements and enhancements at Seneca Lake Park.

PIEDMONT LAKE FUND

Camp Muskingum replaced and relocated their compost bin which provided an opportunity to expand and improve the current composting procedure and added a programmatic and more

highly emphasized educational component to their outdoor education program and everyday conservation programming.



Camp Roosevelt-Firebird's mini-grant provided funding assistance to purchase 10 adjustable backpacks and 5 three-man tents for multiple uses on trips in and out of the camp. "Campers will learn to more deeply appreciate and care for the natural world if they learn to respectfully, proficiently and safely move within it," said Camp Director Joe Mendes.









Camp Aldersgate purchased four Corcls with their mini-grant funding. A Corcl is a popular new round boat for kids on lakes. "The Corcls were a blessing to our campers this summer. Specifically the younger ones who would struggle to navigate a full kayak themselves," said Dan Bajc, Camp Aldersgate Director. "The young campers found it fun to paddle around on these and even be attached to kayaks of older campers and be towed around. It gave our younger campers a chance to get out on the water and enjoy Leesville Lake in a new way! Thank you to the Foundation for this grant that helped to make that possible."

Annual Meeting 2019

The Fourth Annual Meeting of the Muskingum Watershed Conservancy Foundation was held on Friday, January 11, 2019, at the Kent State University at Tuscarawas Performing Arts Center in New Philadelphia.

Keynote speaker for the event was Andrew Bashaw, Executive Director of the Buckeye Trail Association.

The Annual Meeting is our opportunity each year to thank our generous donors and celebrate our successes. The proceeds from the Annual Meeting support the Foundation's Mini Grant Program for youth camps. Each year thousands of children attend the 13 youth camps affiliated with MWCD lakes. Recognizing the impact the camps have on youth education and development, the Foundation Board of Trustees established the Mini Grant program in 2016. The Foundation has provided 13 grants totaling over \$15,000 to youth camps in the three years of the program. Though they are "mini grants," these awards make a big impact on the youth camps along MWCD lakes. The grants help support the great work these youth camps are doing throughout the watershed.
